
Why Go?

When to Go



Nov-Feb

Thailand's 'winter' is the best time to visit.

Mar-Jun

The least desirable time to visit is during Thailand's hot season.

Late Jun-Oct

Expect monsoon rains; storms are usually confined to an hour's downpour.
