Distance 3km
Duration Three hours

1 Launch your expedition at **Franklin Sq.** named after Sir John Franklin, Van Diemen's Land's one-time lieutenant-governor.

5 Skirt around Constitution Dock and the broad Sullivans Cove waterfront to **St David's Park**, Hobart Town's original cemetery.

Classic Photo Arthur Circus is an improbably quaint roundabout lined with Georgian cottages.



2 Trek down Macquarie St into the excellent **Tasmanian Museum**& Art Gallery, incorporating Hobart's oldest buildings.

3 Navigate Campbell and Davey Sts to **Victoria Dock**, built in 1804 and home to Hobart's fishing fleet.
