



Walking Tour: A Stroll through Kampung Baru

This walk reveals a time capsule of a Malay village in the heart of KL, passing traditional wood houses on stilts, a mosque and a Sikh shrine, as well as great places to snack on local dishes.

Start Monorail Chow Kit
Distance 2.4km
Duration Two hours



1 Explore the shaded alleys and busy stalls of lively **Bazaar Baru Chow Kit**. At the back of the market check out the pretty Chinese temple and row of painted wood houses.

Take a Break...

There are food stalls inside Bazaar Baru Chow Kit.

2 Down Lg Raja Bot is the Tatt **Khalsa Diwan Gurdwara**, spiritual home to KL's 75,000 Sikhs and the largest such temple in South-east Asia.

3 **Masjid Jamek Kampung Baru**, founded in the late 1880s, sports a handsome gateway decorated with eye-catching tiles in traditional Islamic patterns.

4 At the junction of Jln Raja Muda Musa and Jln Raja Mahadi stands a photogenic **turquoise and white painted house** dating from 1931.

5 Return to Jln Raja Muda Musa and pass through the modern concrete **Kampung Baru Gateway**.

7 Explore **Jalan Khatib Koyan**, Kampung Baru's most charming backstreet.

6 Built in 1921 by a beloved English-school headmaster, the charming blue **Master Mat's House** sits on a stone pillar and sports a curved white staircase.
