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Why Go?

Many travelers save a chunk of change by flying into Cancún and bussing or driving down to their final destination. Passing through the flat farmland and provincial towns of Northern Belize, they may not be inspired to linger.

But what are they missing? This is a chilled-out stretch of Belize that is entirely void of crowds, with unbeaten paths, abundant wildlife and prices a fraction of those in the rest of Belize.

Northern Belize comprises two districts: Corozal and Orange Walk, both traversed by the straight, flat Philip Goldson Hwy. Off the main road, adventurous travelers will find pretty fishing villages, pristine jungles, ancient Maya cities and anachronistic Mennonite communities.



When to Go

Jan–Apr The dry season opens up top trekking opportunities throughout the region.

Mar–Jun Spot flocks of water birds while cruising in a canoe on stunning Shipstern Lagoon.

• **Sep** Residents from all over Belize come to party at Orange Walk's famous Carnival.
