

Italy's hot-blooded capital is an inspiring city

Once capital of the world, Rome was legendarily spawned by a wolf-suckled boy, grew to be Europe's first superpower, became the spiritual centrepiece of the Christian world and is now the repository of over two millennia of art and architecture. From the Pantheon and the Colosseum (pictured above; p38) to Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel (pictured right; p52) and countless works by Caravaggio, there's simply too much to see in one visit. So toss a coin in the Trevi Fountain and promise to return.

Italy's financial and fashion capital
