TOP SIGHTS



S6 AMALIENBORG SLOT

Visitors can enter one wing of Amalienborg Slot, which features exhibits of the royal apartments used by three generations of the monarchy from 1863 to 1947. The changing of the guard takes place outside Amalienborg at noon daily. (www.kongernessamling.dk/amalienborg; Amalienborg Plads)

RUNDETÅRN

Haul yourself to the top of the red-brick 'Round Tower', which still functions as an observatory, and view the inspiring panorama of rooftops and spires. Halfway up the tower is an exhibition space featuring engaging displays of art and architecture. (www.rundetaarn.dk; Købmagergade 52)



TIVOLI GARDENS

Denmark's most popular attraction, Tivoli is a shamelessly charming combination of amusement rides, flower gardens, food pavilions, carnival games, open-air stage shows and its famous fireworks display. In the evening it takes on a more romantic mood. (www.tivoli.dk; Vesterbrogade 3)




S9 NYHAVN

There are few nicer places to be on a sunny day than sitting at the outdoor tables of a cafe on the quayside of the Nyhavn canal. It was built to connect Kongens Nytorv to the harbour and was long a haunt for sailors and writers, including Hans Christian Andersen.

STATENS MUSEUM FOR KUNST

Denmark's national gallery is the largest art museum in the country and houses art belonging to the royal family. Its collection covers seven centuries of European art, ranging from medieval works with stylised religious themes to free-form modern art. (www.smk.dk; Søvgade 48-50)



DESIGNMUSEUM DANMARK

The Denmark Design Museum boasts an extraordinary, eclectic collection from Europe and Asia. The displays include a large collection of Danish silver and porcelain, and healthy coverage of innovations in contemporary Danish design. (www.designmuseum.dk; Bredgade 68)



U12 CHRISTIANIA

In 1971 an abandoned 41-hectare military camp was taken over by squatters who proclaimed it the 'free state' of Christiania. Alternative folk poured in, attracted by the concept of self-governing, ecology-oriented and generally tolerant communal living. (www.christiania.org; Prinsessegade)



05 ROSENborg SLOT

This beautiful early-17th-century palace has a fairy-tale moat-and-garden setting. In the basement is a dazzling collection of crown jewels. The castle's upper levels house the furnishings and portraits of monarchs. (www.kongernessamling.dk/en/rosenborg; Øster Voldgade 4A)

HISTORY BUFFS

Ruinerne under Christiansborg (O11) The ruins of Copenhagen's earliest fortress and castle. (www.christiansborg.dk)

Thorvaldsens Museum (O10) Denmark's first museum building and a shrine to the nation's greatest sculptor. (www.thorvaldsensmuseum.dk)

De Kongelige Stalde (O11) An equine affair of carriages, uniforms and riding equipment at the Royal Stables. (www.kongehuset.dk)
